1.0 Abstract

- 1.1. From March 2018 to October 2019 Dr Paul Wilkinson MCIfA of Swale and Thames Archaeological Survey Company (SWAT Archaeology) carried out an Archaeological Watching Brief of ground works involved in the excavation for the foundations of the proposed L- shaped retaining wall and with the ground level to be lowered (Figure 1 and Plates 1-12).
- 1.2. An Archaeological Watch was kept during the following tasks (Plates 1-12). Proposed L-shaped wall retaining wall and ground level to be lowered (Task 1) Excavation for footings and steps on the west elevation (Task 2) Levelling off the ground south of the outbuilding (Task 3) Works to the driveway (Task 4)
- 1.3. The archaeological work was undertaken in four phases.
- 1.4. The Archaeological Investigations were to determine whether any significant archaeological remains had survived within the footprint of the proposed groundworks. In particular, any evidence of archaeological activity associated with the known archaeological sites in the area included on the ESCC HER data.
- 1.5. The Planning Application Numbers for the development is Wealden District Council (WD/2017/02320/FR and WD/2017/1018/FR).
- 1.6. Although the archaeological potential has been highlighted by ESCC Heritage Conservation the Archaeological Investigation revealed no buried archaeological features and no archaeological finds were retrieved.

2.0 Introduction

2.1 The site is located to the north of Bolebroke Castle, 1.3 miles NNW of Hartfield village and church and sits in a shallow valley at a height of about 60mAOD. The site is one of only nine Aristocratic and Courtier houses in East Sussex built during the Tudor and Stuart period possibly on an earlier medieval foundation. Bolebroke Castle (formally listed as Bolebroke) was listed Grade II+ on 26th November 1953, its listing reference being TQ 43 NE 5/90. Early mapping indicate a rectangular building adjacent to the proposed area of the current watching brief. An important part of this brief is to record any structural remains that may be exposed as part of the build of the proposed walls and steps. For further details on the history and interpretation of Bolebroke Castle see the David and Barbara Martin 2014 report 'An Archaeological Interpretative Survey of Bolebroke Castle, Hartfield, East Sussex'. 2.2 Planning Background

Two planning applications for the proposed development (WD/2017/02320/FR) and (WD/2-17/1018/FR) has been submitted to Wealden District Council and subsequently granted consent with an attached Archaeological Conditions to the planning consents stating that:

WD/2017/2320/FR-Outbuilding

- [1] Prior to any further groundworks taking place in accordance with the plans hereby approved, a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) shall be submitted to and be agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The required assessment and recording shall be undertaken in accordance with the approved WSI and the findings shall be presented in a format and timetable to be agreed.
- [2] The construction of the walls and earthworks adjacent to the outbuilding hereby permitted shall be undertaken on site in accordance a timetable to be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority within three months of the date of this decision.

The timetable shall take into account the archaeological recording and investigations required by condition 1. The approved scheme shall be fully implemented in accordance with the approved timetable and thereafter retained.

WD/2017/1018/FR- External works

[1] No further development that involves any excavation works exceeding 100mm in depth (including works to the drive) shall take place until the implementation of a programme of archaeological works has been secured in accordance with a written scheme of investigation, including a timetable for the investigation, which has been submitted to and approved by the Local Planning Authority. The works shall be undertaken in accordance with the approved details. A written record of any archaeological works undertaken shall be submitted to the Local Planning Authority within 3 months of the completion of any archaeological investigation unless an alternative timescale for submission of the report is first agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.

(Note: It is understood that the works may be undertaken in phases. It is suggested that the ESCC Archaeologist is contacted at an early stage to discuss the potential for submitting the written scheme of investigation for his approval indicating the phasing so that archaeological works could be undertaken at the appropriate time rather than all at once)

3.0 Schedule of Visits

An archaeologist suitably experienced attended the site (Paul Wilkinson and Peter Cichy SWAT Archaeology) and closely monitored the excavation works in March, April, June 2018 and October 2019.

4.0 Aims and Objectives

- 4.1. The specific aims of the archaeological work were to:
- (3.1) The objectives of the archaeological watching brief are to contribute to heritage knowledge of the area through the recording of any archaeological remains exposed as a result of excavations in connection with the groundworks. Particular attention will be made to the character, height below ground level, condition, date and significance of the deposits.
- 4.2. The ground works tasks were to:
- 1. Ground level to be lowered within the area bounded by the L-shaped retaining wall (Plates 1-6).
- 2. Excavation for footings and steps on the west elevation (Plates 8-9).
- 3. Levelling the ground south of the outbuilding (Plate 10).
- 4. Remove the tarmac drive prior to re-instatement (Plate 11).
- 4.3. A full programme of proposed works by the contractor were made available to SWAT Archaeology before the on-site monitoring took place.

4.4. Confidence Rating

No factors hindered the recognition of archaeological and deposits during the monitoring and recording exercise.

5.0 Archaeological and Geological Background

5.1 The site is located to the north of Bolebroke Castle, 1.3 miles NNW of Hartfield village and church and sits in a shallow valley at a height of about 60mAOD. The site is one of only nine Aristocratic and Courtier houses in East Sussex built during the Tudor and Stuart period possibly on an earlier medieval foundation. Bolebroke Castle (formally listed as Bolebroke) was listed Grade II+ on 26th November 1953, its listing reference being TQ 43 NE 5/90.

5.2. The underlying geology at the site according to the British Geological Survey is map is Wadhurst Clay Formation which comprises soft, dark grey thinly-bedded mudstones ("shales") and mudstones with subordinate beds of pale grey siltstone, fine-grained sandstone (locally calcareous where it is known as Tilgate Stone or colloquially "Hastings Granite"), shelly limestone, clay ironstone and rare pebble beds.

The top metre or so of the Wadhurst Clay often comprises stiff clay stained red by penecontemporaneous weathering.

Thin beds of shelly limestone, rich in Neomiodon and Viviparus, are present throughout. Nodular clay-ironstone occurs particularly in the lower part of the formation, but also near the top. Thicker beds of siltstone and lenticular calcareous sandstone units are also present. The geology revealed on site was yellow brown sandy silty clay (Plate 10).

5.3. The application site consisted of a driveway and small area aside the outbuilding both situated to the south-south-east of the castle. The site of driveway itself is generally level at a height of about 60m OD while the ground aside outbuilding is terraced at height between 58.1m OD and 59.8m OD.

5.4 The archaeological potential is contained within the SWAT Archaeological Specification and dated 8th June 2018).

5.5 The ESHER search data for a 1 km radius from Bolebroke Castle, Edenbridge Road, Hartfield (547536 137712) is attached as appendix at the end of this report. This search includes information from the following datasets: HER data, Archaeological Events, Archaeological Notification Areas (ANA), HE Listed Buildings, HE Scheduled Monuments, and Historic Landscape Characterisation (HLC).

The supplied by ESHER, HER reference number is 044/20.

5.5.2 Archaeological Events: There are 4 results for the specified search area. One record is located 600m to the north and consist excavation of FAULKNERS MEDIEVAL SETTLEMENT.

Further three records are related to the Bolebroke castle and consist: castle architectural survey, SWAT Watching Brief, and ESHBR building survey.

5.5.3 Archaeological Notification Areas (ANA): 3 ANA's fall within the search radius. These records define areas in the county where there is a high potential to discover archaeological remains. Watching Brief area falls within ANA (DES9100) Tier 1 category.

- 5.5.4 HE Listed Buildings: There are 12 in the search area. These sites are registered by Historic England. Two records DES4783 DES6044 are referring, respectively to the castle and gatehouse. Other listed buildings are forming 3 clusters located: 950m to the west, 950m to the east-south-east and 800m to the south east. Listed buildings in the area date back to 15th C with majority dated to 17th C.
- 5.5.5 HE Scheduled Monuments. There is 1 record (DES8207) in the search area. These sites are registered by Historic England. Record consist FAULKNERS MEDIEVAL SETTLEMENT located some 600meters to the north of the castle.
- 5.5.6 Historic Landscape Characterisation (HLC): The watched areas fall under category: Designated Landscapes (HES30120)
- 5.6 There was a very high Archaeological potential within watched areas was to expose Medieval and Post-medieval structures and deposits related to farmstead (MES29929), outbuilding (MES21936), the castle (MES5206) and its history. According to old OS maps, five former buildings were located partially within watched areas or very close.
- 5.6 There was a very high Archaeological potential within watched areas was to expose Medieval and Post-medieval structures and deposits related to farmstead (MES29929), outbuilding (MES21936), the castle (MES5206) and its history. According to old OS maps, five former buildings were located partially within watched areas or very close.
- 5.6.1 According to historic maps existing driveway to the castle was created after year 1910. Before that date the track way was located about 40meters to the east and it was leading towards the gate house. Within area of present day driveway, old maps show little plots surrounded by buildings and one building abutted on the west side of granary, was located across the driveway. Two of the surrounding buildings were located alongside and to the west of drive way area within its southern half. Another building was located to the east of the driveway and was abutted to the SE corner of Granary. All 3 buildings were NNW-SSE aligned and about 20-23 m long.
- 5.6.2 There was very high potential to expose Post-medieval building remains (very likely stables) within area of Trench 1 and related demolition deposits in Trench 2. However current reconstructed outbuilding (Fig.2) doesn't fit into historic layout and it was built within area previously occupied by small train house-station and railways, structures were built in late 20th C. Existing retaining wall to the north of the reconstructed outbuilding, up to granary is defining extent of one old (pre 1799) building. Second old building (Circa from1850 to 1950) was located to the west of the reconstructed outbuilding and retaining wall here, exposed in Trench 1, seems to be its western wall.
- 5.6.3 There was low potential to encounter any pre medieval features or deposits.

6.0 Methodology

- 6.1. The Archaeological Investigations were conducted in accordance with the Archaeological Specification compiled by SWAT Archaeology.
- 6.2. The works comprised the close monitoring of all ground works, including the inspection of subsoil and natural deposits for archaeological features and finds.
- 6.3. Excavation of the area was carried out by contractors using a 360 degree machine equipped with a toothed bucket necessary to remove the subsoil down to formation level (Plates 1-6).
- 6.5. All excavation was carried out under the constant supervision of experienced archaeologists (Dr Paul Wilkinson MCIfA, Bartosz Cichy and Peter Cichy).
- 6.6. Where possible the areas of excavation were subsequently hand-cleaned with the intention of revealing any observed features in plan and section.
- 6.7. If found archaeological features under threat were to be excavated to enable sufficient information about form, development date and stratigraphic relationships to be recorded without prejudice to more extensive investigations, should these prove to be necessary.
- 6.8. The archaeological investigation work was carried out in accordance with current CIfA Standards and Guidance, (CIfA: 2017), and work was monitored by Greg Chuter, the Archaeological Officer from ESCC.

7.0 Results

7.1 General

No archaeological features or finds were revealed or recovered. The deposits encountered in watched trenches were 20th C possibly even 21st C. made ground deposits while deposits exposed in driveway area were associated with 20th C tarmac surfacing and underlying bedding. No archaeological features were revealed in the natural geology and no archaeological finds retrieved from the site.

- 7.2 The area watched were surveyed in and shown on Figure 2.
- 7.3 The site produced no archaeological features or deposits or finds and no environmental potential was recognised on site.
- 7.4 The detailed plan of trenching area (Task 1-3) and associated sections are shown respectively on Figure 3 and 4

7.5 Trenches 1 and 2 (Task 1-3)

7.5.1 Trench 1 (Task 1 and 2)

Trench located on the west side of Outbuilding (front), designated for retaining wall and stairs providing access to the building. The trench has been dug through build up ground comprising earth-gravel access ramp to the building. Trench excavation involved a removal of a big tree stamp located at the corner of the building.

At the base of the trench, alongside the trench perimeter, 0.5m deep footings were dug as shown in Figure 3.

7.5.2 Trench 2 (Task 3)

Trench located on the south side of Outbuilding, designated for retaining wall and providing access to the building. The trench has been dug through build up, steeply sloping ground.

At the base of the trench, L shape, 0.5m deep footings were dug through natural (203).

7.5.3 The Outbuilding is not present on 2014 aerial photograph. The place is occupied by different building. 2009 photo clearly shows narrow railway tracks leading to the building witch at the time appear to have a different form to one visible on 2014 photograph. Between 2009 and 2014 railway tracks were dismantled. Predecessor of the current building was used as a little train house. Modern deposits revealed in trenches 1 and 2 were most likely deposited after dismantle of the railway installation and associated features. See plates 14-16.

7.6 The driveway works (Task 4) involved removal of the crumbling tarmac to the depth of 0.1m revealing driveway make-up deposit of crushed bricks, concrete and sandstone. The bricks were of standard metric size.

8.0 Finds

No finds were retrieved. Majority of encountered bricks were of standard metric size. Standard metric size brick was introduced in 1965. Occasionally in deposits truncated by trenching stock bricks were present. These were derived from demolished 19th C building and partial destruction of retaining wall that runs all the way though the estate, alongside and few meters off to the south of the driveway. Within area of trench 1 the retaining wall was robbed out leaving only broken fragments behind and some modern rubbish (plastic, metal cans, glass wood etc).

9.0 Discussion

The development site is in an area of high archaeological potential. However, no archaeology was revealed on the development site.

10.0 Conclusion

The Archaeological Investigation has fulfilled the primary aims and objectives of the SWAT Archaeological Specification. As far as it is known no buried archaeological features have been affected as a result of the development.






Figure 1: Site location map, sale 1:10000.







Figure 3: Trench plan, scale 1:100






Figure 4: Sections

An excavation was undertaken at Bridge Farm in 2015. A 40m square trench was opened up from the 29th June to 8th August. One of the major results from the season was the discovery of a layer of flint metalling, which was interpreted as the remains of the north road, in situ above a dark demolition/activity layer, which in places was full of burnt clay and overlays the fill of the enclosure ditches. Another major result was to have a single section dug across both enclosure ditches which showed that not only the close similarity of the two but also their 'military-like' V-shape precision, which was replicated at other points across the site where sections were exposed.

The north eastern area of the site proved very complicated with many phases of ditches and postholes appearing and areas of flint surfacing which could be manmade or the result of slumping from the road during heavy flooding. The unexpected complexity of this area has led to the decision to return in 2016 with a possible extension to a trench in a north easterly direction for another summer season. [6]

The projected line of the Roman road (Fig. 1) runs along the west side of the area that was stripped, and it was in the section along this west side that Deposit 006 was noted. It was not possible to see it as a separate deposit from the subsoil (002) during excavation, and it was only noted in the section after the reduction had been carried out. The description of Deposit 006 as a compact area of soil with iron slag above the natural matches Margary's description of the make-up of the road to the north and south of the site, although there was a complete lack of flints found during the watching brief. Built soon after 1600 (Period A) the outbuilding is depicted by Lambert in 1785 as a three-and-a-half storeyed building with a stone-built ground floor and timber-framed walls above, infilled with close studding. The roof at this time was gabled with additional gables in the front roof slope, and perhaps in the rear slope also. Only the three southern bays of this structure now survive, and even this part has been reduced to two storeys in height. The structural evidence indicates that initially it was at least five bays in length (perhaps more) and was occupied by a large dormitory-like room on each of its ground and first floors. and probably on the upper floors also. Although the building was most likely converted to agricultural use during Bolebroke's time as a farm, it was not until between 1785 (when drawn by Lambert) and 1799 (when plotted by Figg) (Period B) that the structure was sized down to form a three-bay, twostoreyed granary. The original roof was reused over the sized-down part, though the front gables were omitted and the end terminals were converted to half-hipped type. A first-floor door was intruded into the south wall, accessed via an external flight of steps. Internally the layout of the retained part remained unaltered, and the same is true of the external walls within the retained part. When finally converted to domestic use during the 20th century large windows were inserted into the eastern ground-floor wall, two chimneys were constructed, a small outshut was added against the north wall, some internal partitions were inserted and a new stair intruded to give improved access to the attic rooms, but otherwise the period- A and period-B fabric was retained unaltered. The use of brick infill indicates that the closestudding is not of the usual thin local plank type, but measures about the same depth as the thickness of the brick infill about 100-125mm (4 to 5ins.). Close studding of this type is usual in many parts of England, but is very rare in Kent and Sussex. The Period B roof, which re-uses some of Period A is of in-line butt-purlin construction incorporating two tiers of purlins, the lower tier has butt purlins which interrupt the common rafters, whilst the upper tier is of interrupted sidepurlin type supporting continuous common rafters laid over their backs. Straker does not record this in 'Wealden Iron' believing this site to be Averies Mill, a corn mill ('Lost mills of the Medway', Sussex County Magazine 13 (1939), 531.) but did mention that a little furnace slag was present. An investigation of the site by WIRG, in March 1980, found a great deal of slag in the river and in the field to the south. Unusually the water supply came through a leat rather than a pond formed by damming a valley. The leat was taken off the river half a mile above the furnace and descending less steeply than the river. A second stream supplemented the supply via a pond boardering the leat about 8yd wide and 125m long. A head of water was thus produced on the valley side, allowing flow over the wheel driving the bellows and through a tail race to the river. This system has a parallel at Lamberhurst Furnace where the 'Great Ditch' at Hoathly was dug to provide power. This was a safer method in a valley liable to flooding or where a bay right across a valley would have been impracticable. Sketch maps are included in the reference. [1]
